Youth Acknowledgment and Waiver

The sailing classes offered by Juneau Youth Sailing are always conducted with safety as the first consideration. However, sailing is an outdoor physical activity with the risks that implies. In any water activity, such as sailing, injury can occur. Our Southeast Alaskan waters are cold, the weather is sometimes miserable, and the water itself presents a hazard. Injury is also possible from improper use of the boats. Bumps, bruises and more serious injuries are possible. Even walking about on the docks or in the training facility has some risks. Falls are always possible and the docks present tripping hazards, the possibility of stubbed toes, and splinters.

In order to minimize the chance of injury, the instructors check over the boats, the docks, and the facility each day for hazards. Hazards that can be eliminated are dealt with through repair or reporting to the appropriate person or agency. Hazards that are inherent to the sport or area will be pointed out to students. The conduct rules set for the classes also aim to reduce the risk of injury by forbidding behavior such as roughhousing or running on the docks and by requiring the wearing of drysuits and PFDs (life jackets) whenever the students are on the water.

Juneau Youth Sailing classes are built around the US Sailing philosophy of “safety, fun, and learning.” Safety is our first priority because our students can’t accomplish the goals of having fun and learning if they aren’t safe.

The use of alcohol or controlled substances is often implicated in on-the-water accidents. No person will be allowed aboard any JYS boat who appears to be under the influence of alcohol or any controlled or illegal substance.

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Youth Behavioral Rules and Guidelines

Juneau Youth Sailing has developed the following behavioral rules and guidelines to help ensure a safe, rewarding, and fun learning environment. It is important that you and your child review these rules and guidelines, sign the form enclosed with the packet return it prior to the deadline. Appropriate behavior is expected at all times.

Classes start and finish promptly at their scheduled times. Students should be dropped off at the site no earlier than 15 minutes before the start of class. Students must be picked up promptly at the end of class. JYS will not take responsibility for children who have been dropped-off or picked-up at a location other than the training site.

The word of the instructors is absolute, and students are expected to obey the instructors at all times.

All students must take a short swim test the first day of class that consists of treading water and swimming along a dock.

Lifejackets (PFDs) will be worn at all times whenever a student is on the docks, or in a boat.

Sailing dry suits will be worn at all times on the water. (Dry suits are provided as part of the course fee. Personal suits will be inspected by the instructor and must meet with his/her approval.)

Observe the boundaries, both on the water and on the shore, as established by the instructors.

No running on the docks, climbing on boat racks, docks, trailers, or rocks near the shore.

Students will pick up their own trash, and are expected to keep their belongings in a neat and orderly fashion.

Students will show respect for their peers, the instructors, and other persons.

Absolutely no throwing of objects is allowed.

No obscene language.

Consequences for failure to observe the above rules and guidelines vary according to the nature of the infraction, but can include loss of privileges, and "time-out." Any verbal or physical abuse, or if your child's behavior jeopardizes his/her own or another's safety, will result in early dismissal from the class and a warning to both the parent and student. A second incident will result in the student's dismissal from the remainder of the session. There will be no refund of tuition or fees.
